1. **St. Luke The Evangelist**
Greek physician attributed with writing the Gospel of Luke and the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.
2. **Mary Magdalen**
A Jewish woman who, according to the four canonical gospels, traveled with Jesus as one of his early and closest followers and was a witness to his crucifixion, burial, and resurrection.
3. **St. Matthew The Evangelist**
A tax collector for the Romans, he was called to be a disciple of Jesus and is attributed with writing the Gospel of Matthew.
4. **St. Patrick**
A fifth-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland, building many churches.
5. **St. Thomas More**
The Lord Chancellor of England, and a lawyer, social philosopher, author, statesman. Martyred during the English Reformation.
6. **St. Therese of Lisieux**
A French Catholic Discalced Carmelite nun, wrote the autobiographical Story of a Soul.
7. **St. Thomas Aquinas**
An Italian Dominican friar, philosopher, Catholic priest, and Doctor of the Church. An immensely influential philosopher, theologian, and jurist in the tradition of scholasticism
8. **St. Camillus de Lellis**
Founder of the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick.
9. **St. Isidore of Seville**
Was a scholar and, for over three decades, Archbishop of Seville. Known as "the last scholar of the ancient world", he assembled extracts of many books from classical antiquity that would have otherwise been lost in his Etymologiae, etymological encyclopedia.
10. **St. Genesius of Rome**
Once a comedian and actor who had performed in plays that mocked Christianity, he had a mystical experience while on stage mocking the sacrament of Baptism. Martyred by Diocletian for not renouncing his faith.

Reflection Exercise & Group Discussion

1. Take 3 minutes to recall a memory related to your job regarding:
 - a. A situation that still brings sadness or bitterness or distaste when it comes to your mind (it may be failure but maybe not...)
 - b. A situation that still brings joy or deep peace or consolation in you when it comes to your mind (it may be a success but maybe not...)

Be patient and let these 2 situations come to your mind. Rather than forcing it, see what comes to you naturally.
